REFLECTION..... for the Epiphany on three astrologers.

The astrologers were amazed. They were living in an eastern country, spending time by studying the stars. A new star had come into view. It differed from the other stars. It was very low and very bright. It was moving from the east to the west. Where was it going? The star resembled a crown of gold, maybe the crown of a king. The astrologers decided to follow it. Someone in the west was to be anointed king, so best to take suitable gifts. They chose gold representing kingship, frankincense for his suffering and myrrh his burial. Even kings may have to put up with difficult situations.

The journey took them to the country where Herod ruled. Despite his reputation as a cruel king, he was particularly pleasant. His own astrologers had not given the right answers about the star, so that he encouraged the three astrologers to go on searching. Should they find this king, he would be delighted to know and welcome him, which was only polite. Would they kindly return this way so that he could go to visit him? Continuing their journey, the three astrologers followed the star which took them to an inn, to Joseph and Mary and the baby Jesus. They bowed down in respect and presented their gifts.

On thinking of returning home, one of them had the hunch that it would be best not to return to Herod. He might change his good behaviour. Best to get out as quickly as possible before Herod knew that they had left. Herod was furious. He ordered all the babies to be slaughtered who were in the vicinity of Bethlehem, which is called "the slaughter of the innocents", in the hope of catching Jesus.

What a relief for the astrologers to get home and to sit again under eastern skies by night, to look at the stars, remembering that wonderful star and the baby in the manger. It had altered their whole view of life. It took them on a spiritual journey to a Kingdom where the infant Jesus reigns as King.
