REFLECTION..... on keeping silence.

One can only regret that in our present world, with the constant noise coming from television sets and the sound of traffic, we cannot reclaim some moments of silence. Silence offers us it's rich benefits of peace and of a deeper understanding of God's purpose for our lives.

The Society of Friends emphasise the importance of silence, contrary to so many popular religious services today, where both the leader and people express their faith loudly in songs and in clapping their hands. Those confined to living on their own, may like this form of worship. By radio or television, they enter into the joyful spirit of worship as though they were present with the worshippers. Others may prefer silence so that in the quiet of their minds they may centre their thoughts on God.

There is no true silence. Even as our natural deafness excludes sounds which some animals can hear, it may be that our spiritual deafness, excludes God's word for us. That may be summed up in the command "to love God and our neighbour as ourselves". Only by our silence before God, shall we rightly express our deepest thoughts and receive the grace by which to hear and obey his word.
